

Application for an AOC in Malta

Steps to acquiring an AOC

- → The process starts off with a preliminary meeting with the Civil Aviation Directorate in Malta.
- → The next step involves the submission of the 'Prospective Operator's Preassessment statement' (the POPS form available at: http://www.transport.gov.mt/admin/uploads/files/2 POPS%20%20Form%20TM CAD.pdf).
- → The POPS form is then followed by a pre-application meeting with the Civil Aviation Directorate in Malta.
- → If the pre-application meeting is successful the application can then be submitted.
- → Subsequent to the submission of the application another meeting with the Civil Aviation Directorate is held to review the documents submitted with the application.
- → After all of the above a decision on whether Malta will accept such an AOC is given.

An applicant for an AOC must:

- → Have his principal place of business and registered office in Malta.
- → Satisfy the Maltese Civil Aviation Directorate that he is able to conduct safe operations.
- → Satisfy the Maltese Civil Aviation Directorate that its organization and management are suitable and properly matched to the scale and scope of the operation.
- → Satisfy the Maltese Civil Aviation Directorate that procedures for the supervision of operations have been defined.
- → Obtain approval from the Maltese Civil Aviation Directorate to hold a second AOC in Malta.

The operator must nominate the following posts:

- → Accountable manager.
- → Quality manager.



- → Safety manager.
- → Head of flight operations.
- → Head of crew training.
- → Head of ground operations.
- → Manager responsible for management and supervision of continued airworthiness.

A person may hold more than one of the nominated posts.

Necessary documentation:

- → The Operations Manual.
- → Compliance Schedule.
- → Operations Approval request form.
- → Resume of Accountable Manager and Post holders.
- → Initial AOC fee = 25% of the AOC fee.
- → Operators Proposed Schedule of Events for the Certification Process.
- → Application for Part M Subpart G CAMO approval (EASA Form 2G).
- → The Continuing Airworthiness Management Exposition Part M.A.704.
- → The Aircraft Maintenance Programme Part M.A. 302.
- → The Aircraft Technical Log System Part M.A. 306.
- → The Technical Specification(s) of the Maintenance Support Contract(s) with Part-145 Approved Maintenance Organisation(s) Part M.A. 708(c).
- → The Number of the Aircraft.
